

Rose Bowl

SUPPLIES:

- Wash-a-way stabilizer such as Vilene or a Med weight tear-a-way (I use the wash-a-way when using the cotton batting and the Med weight Tear-a-way when not using the batting. This is just my preference.)
- Fabric of your choice cut into 7x9 blocks
- Thread of your choice
- Cotton batting (optional)

CC means Color Change

Stitching order is at the bottom of this tutorial.

Please note: There are 2 ways to complete your bowl so please read all the instructions first before starting.

First Method for completing the Rose Bowl

USING BATTING:

There are 2 designs for stitching down the batting, one for the bottom and one for the side of bowl. This is designed so the batting is cut a little smaller than the rest of the fabric so the outside satin edge will not be as bulky.

Follow instructions below to use this method:

1-Hoop stabilizer and place hoop on machine, load the batting bottom design.
Stitch out first CC.



2-Next lay cotton batting over hoop so it covers the outline placement stitch and then stitch next CC.

It will tack down batting in place.



3-Remove hoop from machine and trim close to the stitching line then return hoop to machine then place the fabric over the batting and load the Rose Bottom design you want to stitch.



4-First CC will tack down the fabric and hold in place.



5-Stitch design and then stop at second to last CC(Follow Stitching Chart).
Slide your bottom fabric under your hoop, making sure right side is facing down and covers the bottom area.



6-Then stitch the next CC. Stop before the Last CC and remove hoop from machine and trim fabric away from around the stitching on the top and back then place hoop back on machine and stitch last CC, this will be your satin stitch.



Second Method:

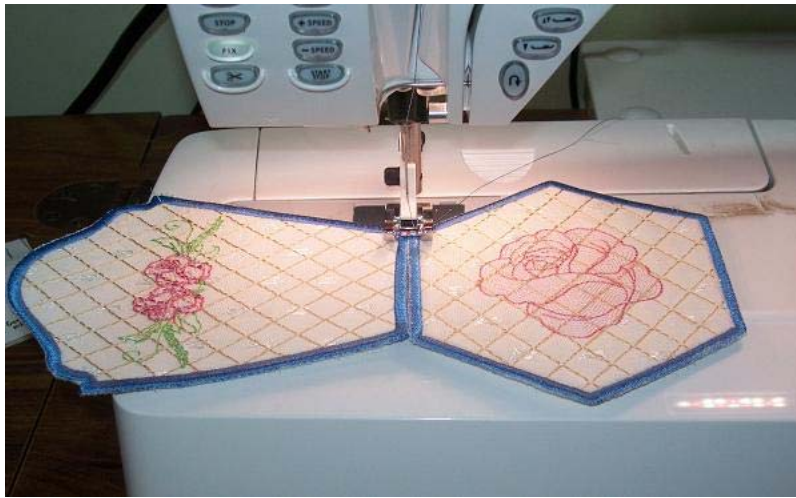
Hoop stabilizer and Start at step 4.

Rose Bowl

Completing the Bowl

Make sure you use the same color thread in the top as in the bobbin that matches the satin outline.

1-Take bottom and your 6 sides, match up the side bottom to one of the edges of the bowl bottom, making sure the center middle is lined up with the middle of your pressure foot and using a wide zig-zag stitch together. Do this for all 6 sides.



Your bowl will look like this when sides have been sewn on.



2-Pull the edges of 2 side pieces together and match up the top then using the zig-zag sew down to the bottom of the bowl. Do this for all sides to complete the bowl.

You can flip the bowl the other way so the roses are on the outside if you wish.

CC 1 – outline – place fabric over stitching

CC 2 – tackdown

Batting Top

CC 1 – outline – place fabric over stitching
