

Vinyl Covered Fishbowls

10 Designs – All fit the 4×4 [Hoop](#)

Vinyl is Appliquéd onto the design.

[Hoop](#) fabric and [stabilizer](#).

Sew design up to the first single stitch fishbowl outline. This is the placement stitch for the clear vinyl.



Take the [hoop](#) out of the [machine](#) and secure a 4×4 piece of clear vinyl on top of the design, making sure that the vinyl extends past the edges of the fishbowl.



Place the [hoop](#) back into the [machine](#) and sew the next stitch, this will be the zigzag that will sew the vinyl securely in place.

Take the [hoop](#) out of the [machine](#) (do not unhoop) and trim off the excess vinyl close to the edges, being careful not to cut the stitches.



Place the [hoop](#) back into the [machine](#) and finish sewing the rest of the design.

Note: The Clear Upholstery Vinyl I used can be purchased at Hobby Lobby, Hancock Fabrics, or most any fabric store. It is a very thin clear vinyl that is commonly used to cover upholstery, books and outdoor furniture.
