Vinyl Covered Fishbowls

10 Designs – All fit the 4×4 Hoop

Vinyl is Appliquéd onto the design.

Hoop fabric and stabilizer.
Sew design up to the first single stitch fishbowl outline. This is the placement stitch for the clear vinyl.



Take the <u>hoop</u> out of the <u>machine</u> and secure a 4×4 piece of clear vinyl on top of the design, making sure that the vinyl extends past the edges of the fishbowl.



Place the <u>hoop</u> back into the <u>machine</u> and sew the next stitch, this will be the zigzag that will sew the vinyl securely in place.

Take the <u>hoop</u> out of the <u>machine</u> (do not unhoop) and trim off the excess vinyl close to the edges, being careful not to cut the stitches.



Place the **hoop** back into the **machine** and finish sewing the rest of the design.

Note: The Clear Upholstery Vinyl I used can be purchased at Hobby Lobby, Hancock Fabrics, or most any fabric store. It is a very thin clear vinyl that is commonly used to cover upholstery, books and outdoor furniture.
