Instructions

The chart below shows the file name for this design and also a photo of the final stitch-out.

Finished Design

Required Materials:

- Water-soluble stabilizer-enough for a double layer for a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop.
- Threads-Color of choice for both needle and bobbin.
- Organza-Organza Ombre makes a strikingly, beautiful angel. (5 x 7 inch piece)
- Ribbon piece-8 inches (for hanger).




The Color Sequence Chart below shows the various sets of stitches required to complete this design.

Color Sequence:


Th.1(Scarlet Flame.574) Th.2(Baltic Blue.574) Th.3(Blue Joy.3032)

| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Transfer the file (NLSEE1997-5x7) to your embroidery machine. 2. Hoop a double layer of water-soluble stabilizer in a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine. 3. Even though the colors for each of the steps in the Color Sequence Chart are shown in different colors, select the color you wish to stitch the angel in and wind a bobbin in the same color. Thread the needle and insert the bobbin. The same color should be used on all three steps in the Color Sequence chart. |  |
| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the angel. |  |
| <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Remove hoop from machine, place on a flat surface, place the organza piece over the placement stitches and tape in place (I use scotch tape and place a piece of tape at the top and bottom of the organza-making sure the tape is not in the stitching area). |  |

6. Return hoop to machine and sew #2 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the organza to the stabilizer.



7. Remove hoop from machine and, using sharp scissors, carefully cut away the excess organza from around the outside of the design.



8. Return hoop to machine and sew #3 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will complete the satin stitches that make up the interior of the angel design.



9. Remove hoop from machine and project from hoop.
10. Cut away all but ½ inch of stabilizer from around the outside of the angel. Leaving ½ inch will prevent the satin stitches from accidentally being cut.



11. Place the angel in a container of warm water. Swish until the ½ inch stabilizer outside of the angel falls away.
12. Press the design between two paper towels. Blot to remove most of the water.
13. Lie flat to dry. You can sandwich the angel between a piece of white fabric and lay a book on top to ensure angel dries flat.
14. Once dry, add a ribbon hanger and give as a gift to a special someone or enjoy it yourself. These are great to insert into a greeting card.
