

FSL-Panda-Bookmark and Vinyl-Keyfob-5x7-CF-NLS

Instructions

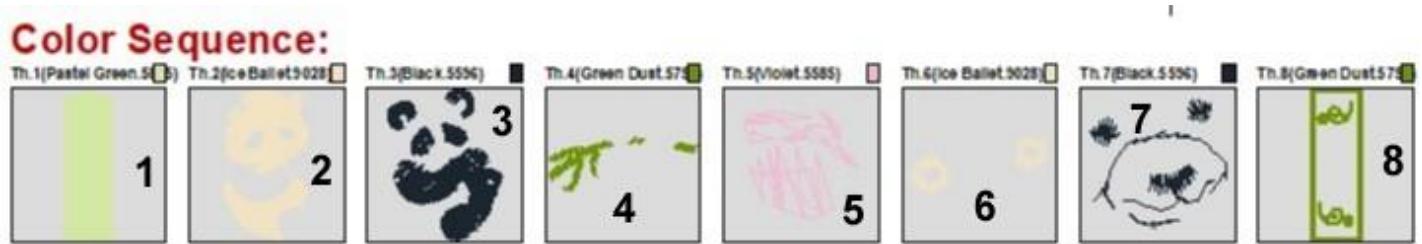
The FSL-Panda Bookmark design is to be sewn on a **double layer of water-soluble stabilizer**.

Each time the needle thread is changed, the bobbin thread must be changed to the same color because the bookmark can be viewed from both sides.

Materials & Cutting Chart for FSL-Panda-Bookmark

Materials
Water-Soluble Stabilizer- Enough for a double layer for a 5x7 inch hoop
Threads-Desired Colors

The Color Sequence Chart below will be referenced throughout the instructions.



<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Transfer the design (NLSEE2130-5x7) to the embroidery machine2. Hoop two layers of water-soluble stabilizer in a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine.3. Thread needle and bobbin thread to the color you wish the lace base to be and sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the hanger and lace base of the bookmark.	
<ol style="list-style-type: none">4. Change both bobbin and needle thread to white for the Panda's body and sew #2 in the Color Sequence chart. These stitches will create the white part of the panda's body.	

5. Change needle and bobbin thread to black color and sew #3 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create most of the black part of the panda's body.



6. Change needle and bobbin thread to green and sew #4 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the bamboo sprig the panda is holding.



7. Change needle and bobbin thread to pink and sew #5 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the pink on the panda's paw.
8. Change needle and bobbin thread to white and sew #6 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the white part of the panda's eyes.
9. Change needle and bobbin thread to black and sew #7 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the eyes and nose of the panda.



10. Change needle and bobbin thread to what ever you want the satin border around the bookmark to be and sew #8 in the Color Sequence Chart.

This completes the sewing of the project.

11. Remove hoop from machine and project from hoop.

12. Cut away all but about ½ inch of stabilizer from around the bookmark.

13. Place bookmark in warm water and swish around until outer stabilizer falls away.

14. Remove from water and use paper towel to blot the bookmark, then lay flat to dry. When dry, your bookmark is ready to use or give as a special gift.

Instructions for the ITH-Vinyl-Panda-Keyfob-5x7

The Color Sequence Chart below will be referenced throughout these instructions.

Color Sequence:

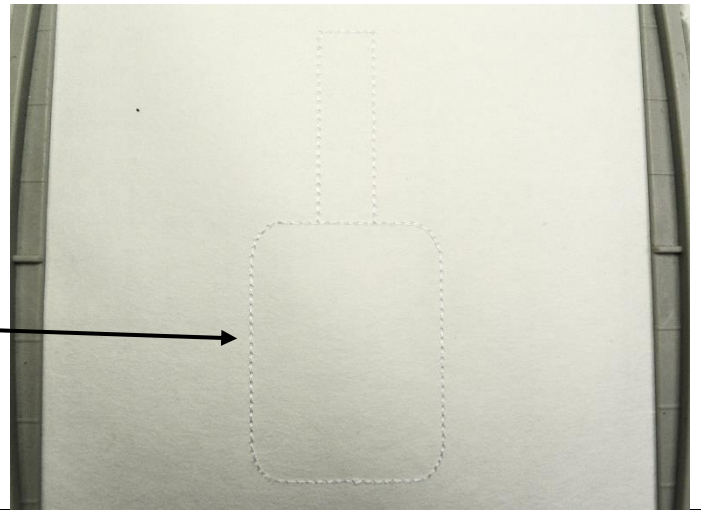


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Materials & Cutting Chart

Materials	Number & Size of Cuts
Vinyl front piece	1 cut at 5.25 x 3 inches
Vinyl back piece	1 cut at 5.25 x 3 inches
Tear-Away Stabilizer	Enough for a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop
Keyfob hardware	1 at 1 inch width
Very sharp scissors	I use Friskers Razor Edge
Kam Snaps	1 set

1. Prepare materials as indicated in the Materials-Cutting Chart above.
2. Hoop tear-away stabilizer in a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine.
3. Transfer the file for the keyfob to the embroidery machine.
4. Change needle and bobbin thread to white and sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the keyfob.



5. Change needle thread to the color of your front vinyl piece-Bobbin can still be white.
6. Remove hoop from machine, place the Front Vinyl Piece over the placement stitches, and secure with tape at top and bottom.



7. Return hoop to machine and sew #2 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the front, vinyl piece to the stabilizer.



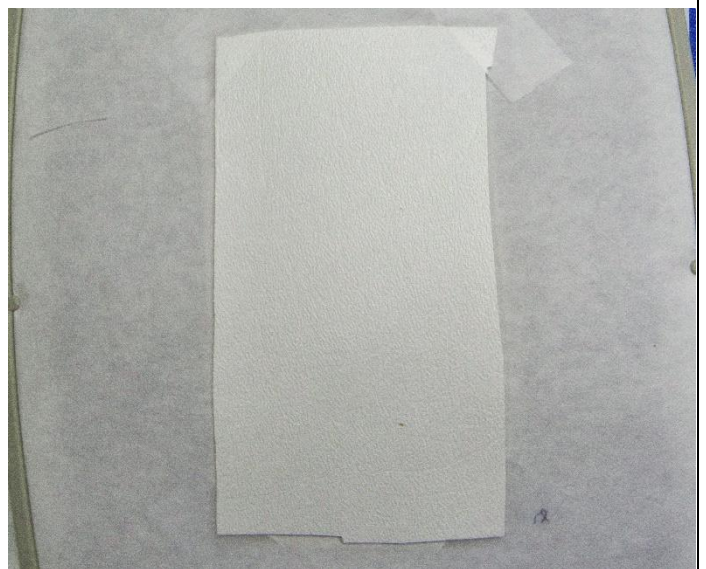
8. Change needle thread to white and sew #3 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the white part of the panda's body.
9. Change needle thread to black and sew #4 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the black part of the panda's body.
10. Change needle thread to green and sew #5 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the bamboo sprig the panda is holding.
11. Change needle thread to pink and sew #6 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the pads on the panda's foot.
12. Change needle thread to white and sew #7 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the white of the panda's eyes.
13. Change needle thread to black and sew #8 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the remainder of the panda bear's features (eyes-nose-mouth).



14. Remove hoop from machine, place upside down on a flat surface, and place the back, vinyl piece over the back of the design. Line up the vinyl with the front vinyl piece and tape in place at all four corners. (Vinyl is placed on back of embroidery hoop.)
15. Change bobbin thread to the same color as the needle thread (same color as the front, vinyl piece.)
16. Return hoop to machine and sew #9 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the back vinyl piece to the project.



Back side of hoop.

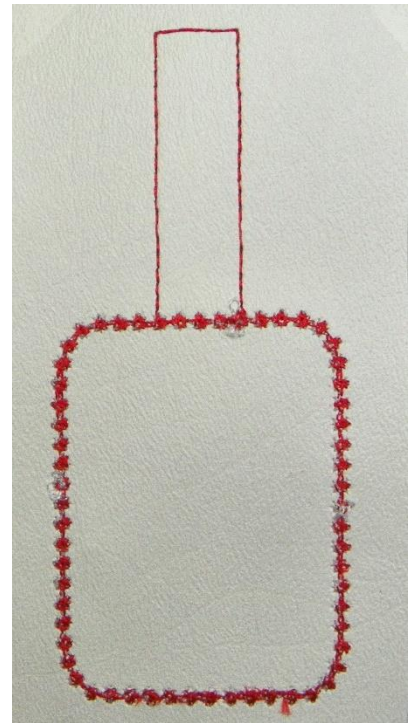


17. Change bobbin and needle thread to the color you want the motif border to be and sew #10 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the motif border around the bottom part of the keyfob. (I used white thread in the needle and red thread in the bobbin.)

18. Remove hoop from machine and project from hoop.
19. Trim away stabilizer from around the vinyl.
20. Using sharp scissors, carefully, cut away the excess vinyl from around the keyfob. Use the outer-most stitches as a guide and cut about ¼ inch from them.



21. Fold the tab to the back of the keyfob and attach the Kam Snaps. Add the hardware and your keyfob is ready to use.
