
Instructions for stitching the FSA-Organza-Crosses

Each of these cross designs are sewn in the same manner. The Color Sequence Charts have been included in these instructions to assist you.

Materials/Cutting Chart


Materials	Cutting Size(s)
Organza or Sparkle Tulle	Cut 2 at 3 x 3 inches each
Water-Soluble-Stabilizer	Enough for a 4 x 4 inch embroidery hoop
Threads of Choice	Whatever color thread you select to use for the crosses, make sure you use the
	same color in the bobbin as the cross will be viewed from both sides.



NLSEE1273 design will be used in these instructions.




- 1. Transfer design to the embroidery machine.
- 1. Thread embroidery machine with desired color-same color in bobbin.
- 2. Hoop water-soluble stabilizer in a 4 x 4 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine.
- 3. Thread the machine with desired color and use same color in bobbin.
- 4. Cut the 2 pieces of organza or sparkle tulle as indicated in the Materials/Cutting Chart.
- 5. Sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the hanger at the top of the cross.
- 6. Sew #2 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the cross.
- 7. Remove hoop from machine and place the two pieces of Organza (or Tulle) over the placement stitches. If desired, tape the material in place.
- 8. Return hoop to machine and sew #3 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will tack the fabric to the stabilizer.
- 9. Remove hoop from machine and carefully cut away the excess fabric from around the cross.
- 10. Return hoop to machine and sew #4 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the remainder of the cross design.
- 11. Remove hoop from machine and project from hoop.
- 12. Cut away most of the fabric from around the cross-be careful not to cut the satin borders. I cut around the cross and leave quite a bit of stabilizer because it will be removed with water.
- 13. Place the cross in water to remove the remaining stabilizer.
- 14. Place cross on a paper towel and blot with another paper towel.
- 15. Lay cross flat to dry.
- 16. Attach a ribbon and your cross is ready to give as a gift. These designs are great to slip into a greeting card or letter.



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





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


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
