



ELEPHANT NIPPLE ATTACHMENT

This fact in 3 steps

1-The horn: 2 pieces of 6cm x 8.5cm high

2-Ears: 2 pieces of 11cm x 8cm high

The inside of the ears: 1 piece of 7.5cmx6cm high

3-The head: 1 piece of 11cmx11cm for the front and 13cmx13cm for the back

Fastener, cotton of the size you desire but not too long for it to be safe

MATERIAL: tearable support, water-soluble support, temporary glue, cord or elastic for the sucking fastener, clip attachment.

THE EARS

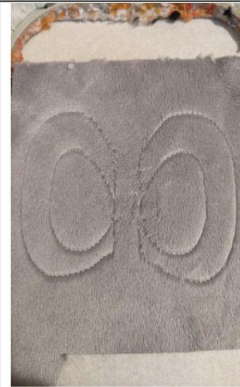


1- The first seam is done on your tearable support

Once this seam is finished, take your first piece of fabric and put the reverse on your support



2- Make the^{2nd} seam, this seam will hold your fabric on your support



3- The^{3rd} seam tells you the location of your inner ear fabric.



Once this seam is finished, put your piece of fabric upside down against your base fabric



4- sewing of your inner ear fabric.
Once this seam is finished, cut the excess fabric and do the next step (bumblebee stitches).

Put your^{2nd} piece of fabric, place against your work



5- sewing to close your ears (sew the front and back of the ears together



Get out of the frame, remove excess fabric, turn to the place and set aside.

THE HORN



1-The first seam is done on your support to tell you the location of your fabric



Put on your first piece of fabric and water-soluble support. Take well evening to hide the structure



2- This seam will keep your fabric and water-soluble support on your base support



3- Make the embroidery stitches

	
<p>4- Put your^{2nd} piece of fabric, place against place on your work and make the last seam</p>	<p>Exit the frame, remove the excess tissue and return. Put a little stuff and set aside</p>

THE HEAD

 <p>7- Seam to hold your left ear in place.</p> <p>Make the right ear the same way</p>	 <p>8- Sewing to tell you whereto put your ribbon for the top of the nipple</p>	 <p>Putting the place of your headband on the place of your work put the part that attaches to the bottom of your work</p>	 <p>9- Seam to hold in place your top ribbon</p>
 <p>To make the bottom part, take the proboscis and hold it in place upwards so as not to sew your proboscis</p>	 <p>Make the seam to tell you the location of your tape from the bottom of the nipple, hold in place and make the next seam to hold your tape in place</p>	 <p>Pay attention to the next seam, put the trunk, ribbons and ears inside the seam of the head. See with the seam you made in the 2nd step, this seam tells you where the next seam is going to be</p>	 <p>Put your fabric for the back of the nipple.</p> <p>You will see why your piece of fabric is larger than the front, with the element that is inside the head it takes a little more fabric.</p> <p>I advise you to reduce your speed to follow the seam and stop the machine if you need to replace the fabric.</p>



Voila, all that remains is to get out of the frame, remove the excess fabric and return to the place.



You must now close the small opening you have left.
