The best Noah's Ark decoration ever! ITH Noah's Ark is made with fabric and wadding, just take all the work out of the project. Make these in less than 60 minutes.

**Skill Level:** Beginner

**Time Required:** 01:00 hours

## **Materials:**

- 5" x 7" and 6" x 10" embroidery hoop.
- White, Yellow, Khaki, Grey and printed cloth Fabric Sheets Pcs.
- 2.5-ounce Cut-away Stabilizer.
- Repositionable adhesive spray
- Needle and white thread
- Fabric scissors
- Wadding

**Designs used in this project:**



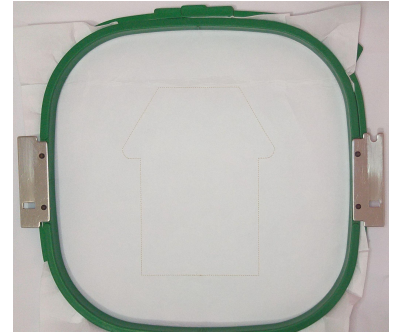
**Step 1:**

For the Top banner tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.



**Step 2:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 3:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.

**Step 4:**

Cover the wadding with khaki fabric.

**Step 5:**

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.



**Step 6:**

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 6.

**Step 7:**

Cover the placement line with printed cloth fabric.

**Step 8:**

Run color-stop 7 to fix the fabric.

**Step 9:**

Run color-stop 8.





**Step 10:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off the excess fabric.

**Step 11:**

Run color-stop 9 through color-stop 11.

**Step 12:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off the excess Khaki fabric.

**Step 13:**

Run color-stop 12 through color-stop 13.



**Step 14:**

Remove the project from the hoop.

**Step 15:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.

**Step 16:**

For the Bottom Banner hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 17:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



**Step 18:**

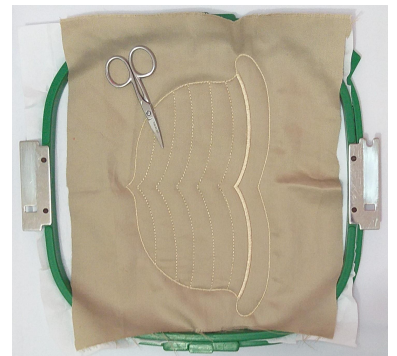
Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.

**Step 19:**

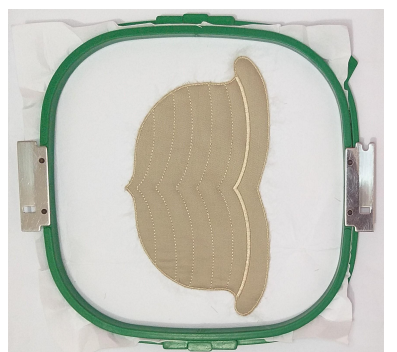
Cover the wadding with khaki fabric.

**Step 20:**

Run color-stop 2 through color-stop 6.

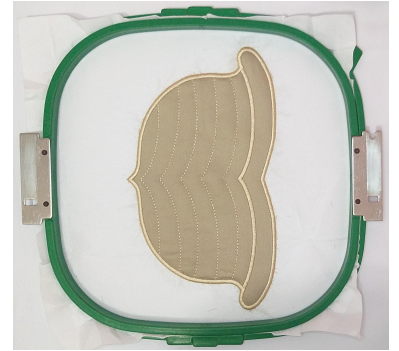
**Step 21:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off the excess Khaki fabric.



**Step 22:**

Run color-stop 7.



**Step 23:**

Remove the project from the hoop.



**Step 24:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



**Step 25:**

For the Tire hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.



**Step 26:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 27:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.

**Step 28:**

Cover the wadding with white fabric.

**Step 29:**

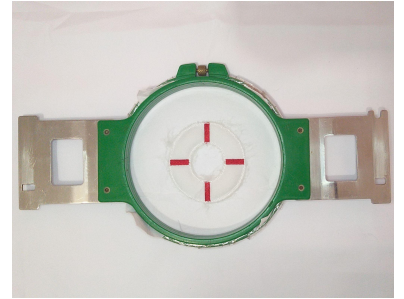
Run color-stop 2 through color-stop 4.





**Step 30:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off the excess fabric.

**Step 31:**

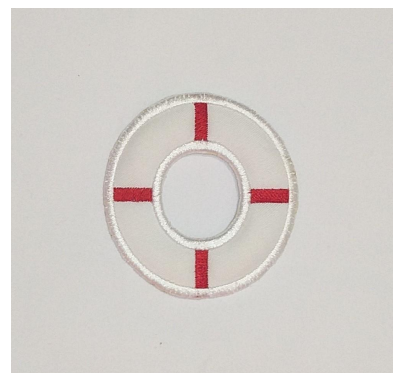
Run color-stop 5.

**Step 32:**

Remove the project from the hoop.

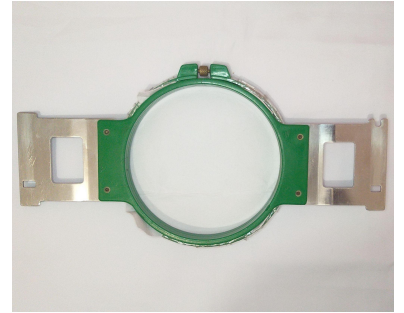
**Step 33:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



**Step 34:**

For the zebra tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 35:**

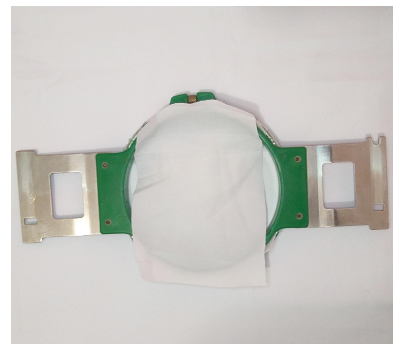
Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 36:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line wadding.

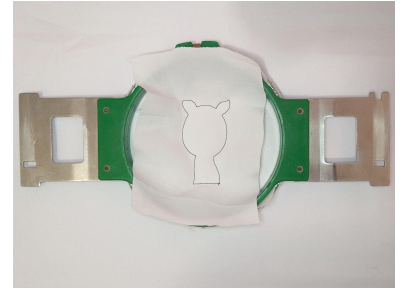
**Step 37:**

Cover the wadding with white fabric.



**Step 38:**

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.



**Step 39:**

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 7.



**Step 40:**

Remove the project from the hoop.



**Step 41:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.

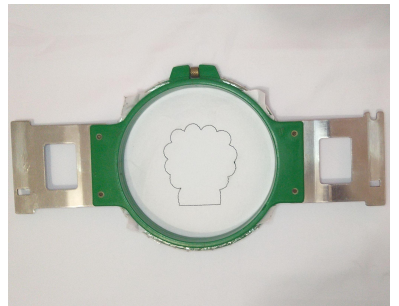


**Step 42:**

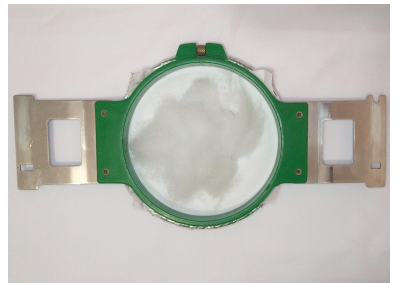
For the Lion tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 43:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 44:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line wadding.

**Step 45:**

Cover the wadding with khaki fabric.

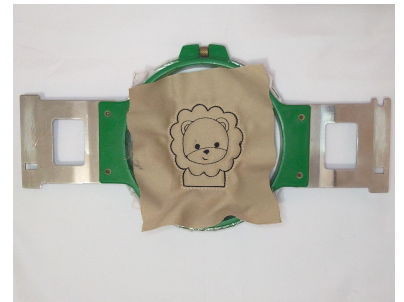


**Step 46:**

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.

**Step 47:**

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 6.

**Step 48:**

Remove the project from the hoop.

**Step 49:**

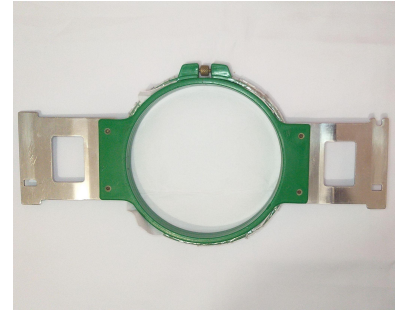
Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



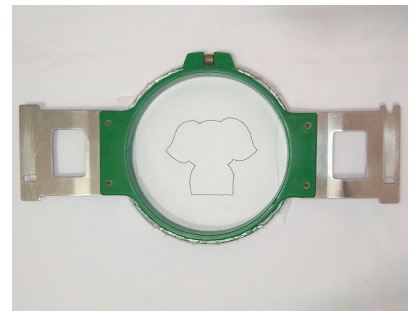


**Step 50:**

For the Elephant tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 51:**

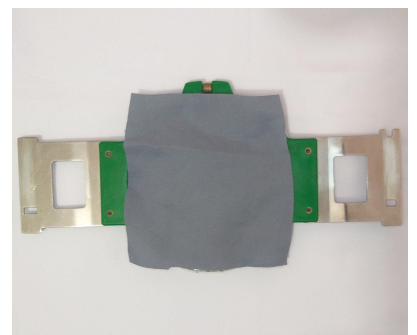
Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 52:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line wadding.

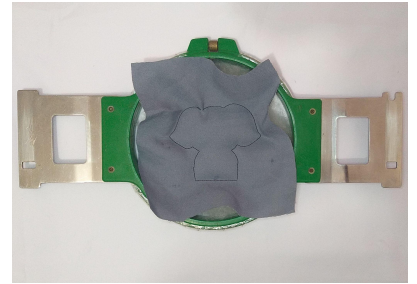
**Step 53:**

Cover the wadding with grey fabric.



**Step 54:**

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.



**Step 55:**

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 6.



**Step 56:**

Remove the project from the hoop.



**Step 57:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



**Step 58:**

For the Giraffe tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 59:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 60:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line wadding.

**Step 61:**

Cover the wadding with yellow fabric.



**Step 62:**

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.



**Step 63:**

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 8.



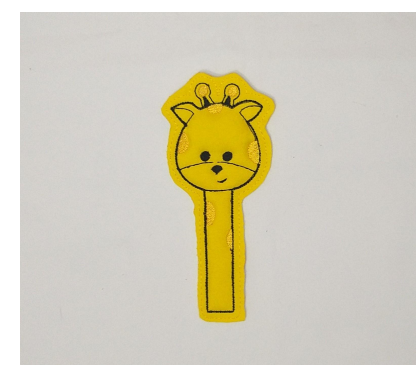
**Step 64:**

Remove the project from the hoop.



**Step 65:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



**Step 66:**

For the Banner tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.

**Step 67:**

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 68:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line wadding.

**Step 69:**

Cover the wadding with white fabric.





**Step 70:**

Run color-stop 2 through color-stop 4.

**Step 71:**

Cut the excess of fabric, run the color-stop 5 and remove the project from the hoop.

**Step 72:**

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors.



**Step 73:**

It's time to put all the pieces together.

**Step 74:**

With the help of a needle and thread or some type of textile glue, join the pieces as they are arranged in the image and make sure to place a cord to hang it. Have fun doing this beautiful project.
